

Exam Supervision

Most ADLC courses have summative Final Exams. Many also have summative Mid-Term Exams. Exams are supervised evaluations that operate under standard rules of test invigilation and within specified time limits (unless a student has school approved special accommodations).

Students registered with ADLC by an Alberta school partner will be supervised by that school in accordance with that school's policies and procedures. Circumstances (eg: student travel, summer course completion, distance learning, etc) may prevent students from writing in their registering school.

In such cases, students will be required to make local arrangements for exam supervision and complete an Exam Supervisor form, which can be obtained from ADLC Lessons & Exams. ADLC prefers its local Exam Supervisors to have a Teaching Certificate from their local jurisdiction, but other professional roles will be considered if a certificated teacher is unavailable.

Any expenses for exam supervision (transportation, proctoring fees, etc.) are borne by the student and/or their registering school.
